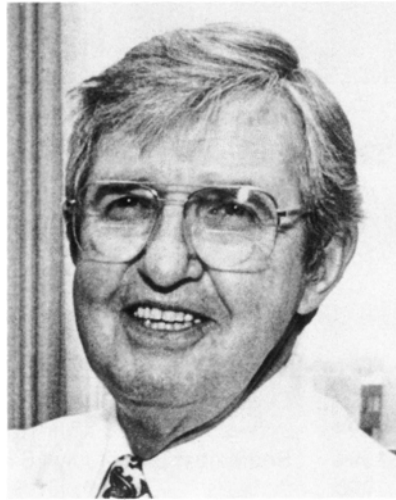

CHARLES RICHARD HARRELL

We are saddened to announce the death of our colleague and friend, Charles Richard Harrell, who died on January 3, 1993. Charlie trained in nuclear medicine technology and radiologic technology at the U.S. Navy X-Ray and Nuclear Medicine School in Bethesda, Maryland in 1951. He was a pioneer in our industry, and he always entertained us with stories from the early days. He was one of the original members of The Society of Nuclear Medicine, and he belonged to the Technologist Section of the SNM MidEastern Chapter and the Maryland Association of Nuclear Medicine Technology. He served on committees for all of these organizations.

After leaving the U.S. Air Force in 1968, Charlie worked as the supervisor of nuclear medicine at Church

Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland until 1959. In 1969 he moved to Saint Joseph Hospital, Towson, Maryland, where he held the position of admin-

istrative coordinator until he retired in 1988. After retirement, Charlie volunteered in the nuclear medicine department at Saint Joseph, conducting the weekly wipe tests and other tasks in order to help reduce the technologists' busy work load.

Charlie was a happy and fulfilled man, who loved his family as they loved him. He was generous, loyal, and a credit to the nuclear medicine community. He always had a smile and a story. Anyone who met Charlie will remember him, and those of us who worked with him will never forget the wonderful and gentle man whose first thought was always of others. May he rest in peace.
