

The spring meeting of the JRCNMT was held April 13–14, 2012, in Atlanta, GA. During this meeting, the board of directors affirmed 1 request for voluntary withdrawal of accreditation due to program closure. Substantive changes from 2 programs were also approved.

Third-party testimony, written and oral, must be limited to the educational program’s compliance with the *Accreditation Standards for Nuclear Medicine Technologist Education*.
